- 2. The men listed above voluntarily and without coercion answered all calls for assistance by the various branches of the naval forces defending WAKE ISLAND during the resistance of the garrison from 8 December to 23 December, 1941. They took over the responsibilities of furnishing all hands with food and water, distributing gasoline, ammunition and other supplies essential to defense. They aided in servicing and repairing airplanes, maintaining communications, providing transportation, constructing personnel and airplane shelters, repairing bomb damage, burying the dead and caring for the wounded. Much of this work was done at night and in disregard of their own safety and comfort. Their efforts relieved the military personnel in a large measure from non-military duties. Their conduct was an example to their fellow workers, a source of pride to their countrymen, and was at all times in keeping with the highest traditions of the naval service.
- 3. Information as to addresses and next of kin is on file in the Bureau of Yards and Docks.
- 4. Recommendations so far made for recognition of the services of civilians on WAKE ISLAND will be supplemented when information from Colonel J. P.S. Devereux, USMC, as to the assistance given by them to the First Defense Battalion, comes to hand.
